

Jason Russell Memorial Scholarship



Jason Russell graduated with honors from Russellville High School in 1998. While attending RHS, Jason was Vice President of his senior class, played basketball and baseball. He was a member of the National Honor Society. He was intrigued by anything to do with math, and excelled at everything he did. He attended Missouri Boys State in the summer of 1997. When he returned from Boys State, he started racing cars on the local dirt tracks.

After graduation he attended Mizzou, majoring in electrical engineering, and then joined the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers, completing their five year apprenticeship program. He worked his way up to journeyman electrician, and attained his Master's Electrician license. After working for a local electrical contractor, and being named Vice President, he opened his own electrical contracting company in 2018. He was a member of the Electrical Industry Council at State Tech in Linn, and helped make their Electrical Industry program what it is today. He was a trustee with the IBEW-NECA Pension Fund.

Jason was a very determined individual and strived to be the best at everything he did. During his 22 year racing career he won 207 feature races and 13 championships. He drove street stocks, sportsman, A modified, and Late Model race cars. Twice in his racing career he won driving in three different classes of cars on the same night. This was a feat accomplished by very few racers, and he was one of them.

Tragically, Jason was killed in a boating accident at the age of 39. His family would like to offer this scholarship in his memory to benefit a student with a drive for excellence, determination, and dedication.
