SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES 2018-2019

During Optimist International's 100th Anniversary year, the Optimist Club of Jefferson City is encouraging area students, <u>under the age of 19 as of October 1, 2018</u>, to participate in this year's ESSAY and/or ORATORICAL contests for college scholarships.

This year's essay subject is "When All the World's Problems are Solved, is Optimism Still Necessary?" Each participant will be required to complete an application and submit it along with the essay. The essay must contain at least 700 words but no more than 800 words (every word in the essay is counted - but does not include the Title, bibliography or foot notes; and hyphenated words count as one word). Further guidance on official contest rules will be found on the application itself which must be submitted with the essay along with a copy of the student's birth-certificate or passport to validate age eligibility. The deadline for submission of ESSAY contest will be January 25, 2019, and contest application, essay, and copy of birth certificate/ pasport should be mailed to Optimist Club, P.O. Box 105095, Jefferson City, MO 65110. Local winners will receive a medal award and advance to District competition to compete for a \$2500 college scholarship.

The Optimist Club will hold a **combined gender oratorical contests** with boys and girls. Interested students should prepare their own speech on **this year's topic**, "**Is There a Fine Line Between Optimism and Reality?**" The contestants may receive advice in the preparation of the speech and may make minor changes or improvements in the speech at any time. The official contest rules are found on the application itself. The speech should be at least four minutes but not longer than five minutes, and any quotations or copyrighted material used in the speech must be identified verbally during the presentation and in the written copy of the speech with the original author's name. The Optimist Oratorical Contest gives young people the chance to speak before others and gain confidence in public speaking. All contestants at each level of competition must furnish a **copy of their birth-certificate or passport** to validate age, **with their entry application** before competing. Local winners at the Club level will receive medallions and advance to Zone, Regional, and District competition to compete for a \$2500 first place, \$1500 second place, and \$1000 third place scholarships at District level. The **deadline for submitting oratorical applications** to the Club will be **February 15, 2019**, and

the Club level contests will be held March 4, 2019 with backup date March 18, 2019. If contestant would like mentoring please indicate that on your application. Return your application, a written copy of the speech and copy of birth certificate/passport to the Optimist Club, P.O. Box 105095, Jefferson City, MO 65110 as early as possible to allow time for a mentor to assist. Remember, the club contest is only 16-days beyond the application deadline so don't wait until the deadline to request a mentor.

A college scholarship worth \$2500 will be awarded to the winner at the District level ESSAY contest. A \$2500 scholarship, a \$1500 scholarship, and a \$1000 scholarship will be awarded at the District level ORATORICAL contest for the 1st place, 2nd place, and 3rd place winners. The District winner will advance to the International Regional level to complete for a \$5000 1st place scholarship and chance to advance to the International World championship level to compete for \$15,000, \$10,000, and \$7,500 scholarships (1st, 2nd, and 3rd places). **Overall, the Oratorical winner has the potential to win a total of \$22,500 in college scholarships.** The Optimist International World championship contest will be held June 18-20, 2019, at St. Louis University, St. Louis, MO. The winner at the Optimist International World championship level will also be given an engraved plaque and recognition in *The Optimist* magazine.

"Young students today have so many fresh ideas about the world and their future," Club President Jim Weber said. "As Optimists, it is our goal to encourage them and do what we can to bring out the best in each of them. This gives them a wonderful opportunity to tap into their creativity and pursue possible scholarships at the same time." The Optimist Club of Jefferson City has been participating in these contests for more than 50 years and has been actively serving the youth in the community since June 1946.

- 2. Contestants must enter through a local Optimist Club, or an At-Large contest if a local club is not available. An At-large student may not have competed in an Optimist International or District contest in the same year.
- 3. Contestants must compose an original essay with limited guidance from others. Webster's dictionary defines an essay as an analytic or interpretative literary composition. Works of fiction or poetry will not be accepted.
- 4. All District-level competitions must have a minimum of 3 contestants participating.
- 5. Optimist International will have the right to edit, publish or otherwise duplicate any essay entered into the contest without payment to the author.

Section II - Qualifications for Contestants

- 1. The contest is open to students under age 19 as of October 1st of the current Optimist International Contest year (October 1 - September 30) and is not enrolled as a degree seeking student of a post-secondary institution. Students must enter in the District in which they reside. U.S. students attending school on military installations outside the U.S. are eligible to enter in their last home of record.
- 2. Contestants are eligible for only one Club's contest during any given year.
- 3. No student who has previously won a District Optimist Essay contest scholarship will be

Section III - Contest Rules

- 1. Participants must write on the official topic.
- 2. Each entry must begin with a title page containing: the official topic, number of words, writer's name, address, phone number, name of school and date of birth.
- 3. At the top of page 1 should be the official topic and the number of words (penalty of 2 points for lack of topic in and 5 points for failure to identify the total number of words correctly).
- 4. Essays must be typewritten and double-spaced. (Deduction of 5 points)
- 5. Essays must contain at least 700 words but no more than 800 words. Every word of the essay is counted. This does not include the title, bibliography or footnotes. Hyphenated words count as 1 word (Deduction of 5 points for each 25 words over/under limit).
- 6. Each page of the essay must be numbered starting with page 1 of the essay, not the title page. The numbers must be centered at the bottom of each page.
- 7. Any quotations or copyrighted material used must be identified properly. For example, use of a specific writer's format (such as MLA) may be specified by the instructor overseeing the contest. Failure to identify non-original material will result in disqualification.
- 8. No references can be made in the essay that identifies Burners the student, parents, school, community, and the student of format: 5 points

- qualified judges. At the Club level, judges may be Optimist Members, who are not acquainted with the contestants. At the District level, judges must be non-Optimists.
- 2. In an effort to conceal the identity of each contestant, each entry will be assigned a number by the Essay Contest Chair. The assigned number will be placed on the title page and page 1 of the essay. The title page will then be detached and retained by the Essay Contest Chair. The judges will be given the essay bearing only the assigned number.
- 3. Judges will not discuss or compare essays being judged.
- 4. Only judges can assign a penalty or award points.

Section V - Scoring

Scoring procedures at all levels of the contest will

- 1. Material Organization logical interpretation of the subject, adherence to topic: 30 points
- 2. Creativity 10 points
- 3. Vocabulary and Style phrasing and continuity: 30 points
- 3. Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling: 20 points
- 4. Neatness: 5 points
- 5. Adherence to Contest Rules prepared in the proper

Section VII - Awards

- 1. Club level medallion
- 2. District level plaque and a \$2,500 college scholarship for the first-place winner
 - A. Scholarships are funded by the Optimist International Foundation in the U.S. and Caribbean or the Canadian Children's Foundation in Canada, Scholarships awarded are for use at a college, university or trade school only.
- B. All scholarships will be payable to the educational institution of the recipient's choice, subject to the approval of Optimist International.
- C. All scholarships will be administered by Optimist International.
- D. Winners of an Optimist International scholarship must claim their scholarship by the age of 25.
